Outreach: Megarie van Sickel and Barbara Davis

The Outreach team met in October to plan for a busy Christmas and winter season of activities to help those in the community.

The team set up the Christmas schedules and plans for the Salvation Army Bell Ringing collections as well as the Salvation Angel Tree Ministry and the Prison Ministry children's gift programs.

Katherine Riherd heads up the Bell Ringing kettle donation program, coordinating with the Salvation Army, Walmart and our church volunteers. The schedule this year will run in two hour sessions, from 9-5 p.m., on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from November 28-December 24, with two people on each shift. Sign-ups began on November 2.

Desiree Hudson and Elizabeth Townsend are organizing the Salvation Army Angel Tree Ministry for underprivileged Venice area children to receive Christmas presents from our parishioners. The Salvation Army provides the list of children and their gift wish list for parishioners to make purchases. The unwrapped gifts are delivered from the church to the Salvation Army for distribution.

Libby Chinman, assisted by Barbara Davis, will administer the Prison Angel Tree Ministry Christmas gift program which provides presents to children of incarcerated parents on their behalf. This year the Prison Ministry has given the names of 11 children who have a parent serving a sentence. The suggested price limit is \$30 and gifts should be wrapped. The gifts will be delivered to each caretaker's home by Libby and Barbara in December.

The Salvation Army and Prison Ministry children's info and gift suggestions will be written on tags and combined on a single Christmas tree for parishioners to select from starting in November.

Children First's Head Start preschool in Venice continued to receive weekly bread and bakery items from our Publix and Panera donations. Megarie delivers a box of the baked goods to the early education school every Monday morning. Students and their families, as well as staff, are most appreciative.

The Outreach Ministry received a very heartfelt letter of gratitude from one of our five \$1,000 each scholarship recipients. The nursing student wrote about her deep appreciation for the tuition funding, how her classes are going, and that she found out she has been studying with another of our grateful recipients.

The Outreach Ministry was thrilled to learn from a Good Shepherd parishioner that he will be donating \$5,000. to fund additional scholarships to needy local students pursuing professional and technical careers. The generous parishioner wishes to remain anonymous.

We will be presenting Habitat for Humanity homeowners with a gift of a first aid kit at the dedication of their new home.

Outreach Ministry members were featured on two of Fr. Joe's Wednesday chats on the email news blast during October to support the annual fund campaign. Megarie and Barbara gave an overview of all the Outreach projects that occur throughout the year. Grace Gagliardi was interviewed about the Publix and Panera donated bakery items bread ministry.

The Outreach team is pleased to be able to support so many community projects. We are grateful to the congregation for both volunteer and financial support.
