GOOD SHEPHERD VENICE RECTOR REPORT - As a church, our Average Sunday Attendance (ASA) continues to increase. Waste Management delivered our new trash dumpster and removed our old one on April 4, 2023. Kurtz Plumbing repaired a urinal in the men's restroom on April 11, 2023.

Our old stove was disconnected and removed by Junk King on April 10, 2023. They also removed four pews which were not being used. Our new stove (stainless steel, 2 doors, 6 burners with grill) was delivered on April 17, 2023. Barton Propane detected a leak in our propane system (outside) and will make the necessary repairs and connect our new stove.

The gutter/downspout by our front entrance was not functioning and caused rain water to overflow to the walkway. Superior Home Services dismantled, cleaned, and repaired the unit on April 21, 2023.

Bob Clark and Duane Ruppert repaired a pipe on our irrigation system in the Memorial Garden on May 1, 2023. We have found two more diseased slash pine trees on our property. One in the Memorial Garden and one in our side yard (NE corner), just off the end of our parking area. We will get estimates from Simply Trees for their removal.

Sally Mock, Stephanie Kitt, Barbara Johnson, Melissa Wall, and Dottie Eastman cleaned out our last storeroom (used by our tech team in the back of the Nave). They retained some items for future receptions and English Teas which Melissa Wall would like to continue after our Church has been restored. Thank you, ladies!
