Report is for activity during January and February 2024

Dave Beall and I cleaned out our shed behind the church and scheduled Junk King to remove unwanted items and our old gutters. Simply Trees trimmed the large live oak tree near the pergola which will make it easier for MetalMax to access our roof with their construction materials. Bob Clark arranged to have the bronze plaque in the Memorial Garden restored with impressive results. Heights Aluminum installed our new gutters and downspouts on January 29 – 30, 2024. Dave Beall and I visited Lykins Signtek and discussed putting our new aluminum poles in "sleeves" so they can be removed, as necessary. The new signposts for our Church banners are expected to be in place prior to Easter. I met with Bob Clark and Sally Mock on February 1st to discuss several issues relating to the Memorial Garden and the church grounds. We agreed on a strategy to coordinate several tasks which will involve our volunteers and our lawn service. I spoke with Superior Home Services who will pressure wash the walls around the pergola, concrete benches, Celtic cross, and our sign and cross at the Center Road entrance. We have signed a service agreement with JanPro, a professional janitorial company who will clean the interior of our church twice weekly. We

have also identified a handyman who will assist with various projects associated with our ongoing restoration. Aqua Plumbing completed our annual backflow inspection for our drinking water on February 16, 2024. Piper Fire Protection conducted our annual fire suppression (sprinkler heads), fire hydrant, and fire suppression backflow inspection on February 23, 2024. Overall, the inspection went very well, and we are awaiting the written report. We are due for our five-year inspection this spring which I will schedule and monitor.
